Treasurer Russell Shrader presented the March 2014 Financial Summary showing a Beginning Balance of \$14,327.80 and an Ending Balance of \$14,427.85 The was little financial activity during the month of March mainly a small deposit of

revenue from the Children's Film Festival and Club fines.

Pres. Coleman stated that there is a percentage of the final revenue received by the film producers due the Club. When that revenue is received, the Club Treasurer can make final adjustments to the account such as transferring all Film Festival revenue collected over to the Foundation and requesting repayment of the Grant presented to the Foundation.

Rick received a letter from the State Comptroller's Office requesting a Franchise Tax Report for the Foundation. Rick advised now that the Foundation is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit entity we need to be taken off the Tax Rolls.

Jack Hopkins will contact the Comptroller's Office and present the Foundation's Letter of Determination for consideration.
